Dear President, Dear Charles,

While the protection of public health was our overriding priority in our fight against Covid-19, some of the restrictive measures that were put in place have disproportionately hit border regions, impacting the fundamental principle of free movement. Given the human and economic importance of our border regions, their functioning is critical to the very fabric of our Union.

At the onset of our discussions on the lessons learned of the Covid-19 crisis, we call on including the specificities of border regions in our reflection. We need to ensure that we can better protect the interests of European citizens who regularly cross internal borders, especially at times of crisis. Therefore, Belgium, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxemburg, and the Netherlands propose the introduction of a "cross-border test" in EU policy making, as described into more detail in the position paper attached to this letter.

We are looking forward to our discussions.
